

Service Learning Project (SLP) for Juniors

This is a required project for all juniors.

Rationale:

It gives students an opportunity to learn more about their community, see the needs in the community, and give of themselves to better their community.

Requirements:

- o Choose a service project.-Must be nonprofit
- o Write a proposal memo following the format on the website.
 - Due no later than: December 4, 2015**
 - (Proposal is due before starting the project of volunteering.)
 - a. It must be typed.
 - b. It must have the required signatures.
 - c. It must be approved by the instructor.
- o Volunteer at the site for at least 8 hours.
- o **The project cannot be a family business/organization or a business that operates for profit.**

WHAT IS DUE MAY 2, 2016:

- Sponsor's signed performance evaluation form stating that the student has performed the duties- turn this in on May 2, 2016.
- PowerPoint for class presentation
- Printed copy of the power point- 4 slides/page
- Two-page evaluation/reflection of the project- turn this in on May 1, 2015.
 - a. typed
 - b. double-spaced, Times New Roman, size 12 font
 - c. one inch margins

OTHER THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- o Be sure to take photos of the volunteer services being performed.(Student should be in these when possible.)
- o The student will need at least 7 photos of the activity and one of the photos **MUST** be a photo of the student at the volunteer site with the person who is sponsoring the activity.
- o The student will give a presentation of the project for the class.
- o The final presentation items listed above will be due on May 2, 2016.
- o Final presentations will be given in class starting on May 11, 2016. (Subject to change.)
 - The total project is worth 150 points.
 - 25 points will be awarded in the first semester for the proposal.
 - 125 points will be awarded in the second semester for the completion and presentation of the project.

Note: Should the student need to change from one SLP to another, a new proposal must be submitted, but no additional points will be given for the new proposal. Changes must be done with the approval of the instructor prior to starting a new SLP.
